- · To develop engaging content to be ideally posted out weekly on your Teams site to engage your learners and create a positive learning community.
- · To actively signpost students to the appropriate sources of support.
- To participate in supervision meetings with a member of the Union PAL team and your Academic Liaison*.
- To work with your Academic Liaison* to create informative and engaging materials to support students' transition to higher education.
- To support with the collection of feedback when needed to enhance the scheme.
- · To report to the PAL Coordinator with any trends or struggles students are facing.
- · PAL Leaders are representatives of the Union and should always reflect Union values and be willing to share Union messages as required.
- To keep to professional boundaries when in post.
